Term Overview

As expressed in the previous report the uncertainties of COVID are still present (decisions are made based on federation communication) although the development is taking place in terms of allowing more sporting codes to continue on all levels (which allows planning to move to final stages). The RALU & Cluster Games (collaboration with Maties Sport on one of my initiatives) has been green lit by all Sports Managers and is set to start in term 2. The Excel live sheet (created last year) is being currently being updated with a section to allow Sport Managers to also be able to communicate with Sports HK's if necessary. Additionally collaborations with Action4Inclusion has been recently (14 May 2021) received by the HP Manager and confirmation will take place.

The budget remains the same at estimated R7000 for events although from conversations that I have had in meetings with Mr Laka, the need to have a budget to fund student athletes is resurfacing because HP Sporting codes are resuming competitions. This will be discussed and confirmed throughout the next term.
