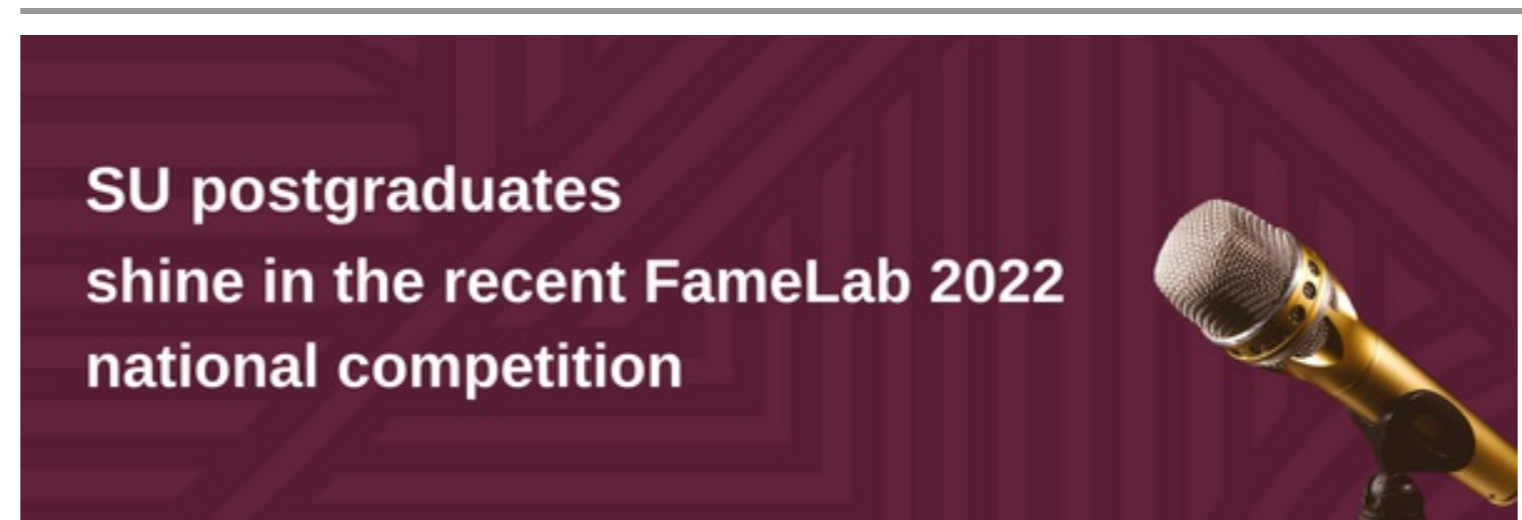


#### HB and MJ Bursary

#### SU represented by three super stars in the recent FameLab 2022 national competition!

Of the top ten national finalists who competed at the **FameLab 2022** national competition event on 28 September 2022, three were SU postgraduates: Tarryn Surajpal (winner of our PGO institutional heat for the 2022 FameLab cycle), Tanya van Aswegen (first runner-up of our PGO institutional heat for the 2022 FameLab cycle) and Ewura-Esi Manful (who entered the 2022 competition via a SAASTA sponsored FameLab regional open heat!)



**Tarryn Surajpal** is a Faculty of Science Applied Mathematics Master's candidate. Her research uses Computational Fluid Dynamics (CFD) models to simulate discharges into the ocean to help us understand what the effluent from desalination plants does to marine life. She hopes that her work will help to minimise negative environmental impacts while ensuring water security as we increasingly rely on ocean desalination (**source**).

**Tanya van Aswegen** is a Faculty of Medicine and Health Sciences Psychiatry PhD candidate. Her research looks at the early relationship experiences of children and how this influences brain, social and emotional development into adulthood (**source**).

**Ewura-Esi Manful** is a Faculty of Medicine and Health Sciences Molecular Biology Master's candidate. Her research investigates drug resistance to infectious diseases – she wants to bring hope to drug-resistant TB patients through her research (**source**).

We are very proud of these three individuals who are setting the bar high as talented science communicators. The winners of the 2022 national event will be announced on 17 October 2022.

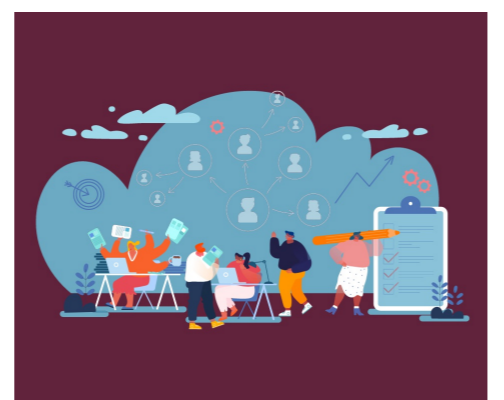
#### Research data management library guide

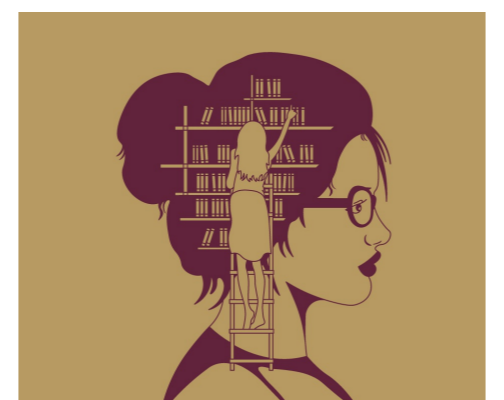
